Change



Thank you for all your good wishes and very generous gifts as many of you shared in the joy of our wedding day back in July. Following that very special occasion Cath and I, together with her daughters and members of my family travelled to South Africa. Our main objective was to meet members of Cath's family who were unable to come to the wedding. So, we had an extra blessing on the beach with Cath's brothers and their families present.

Almost as important was to see those places where Cath grew up. Indeed, when we visited Fish Hoek (the seaside town just outside Cape Town where Cath grew up) and were looking for the first family home, we were very fortunate that the current owner allowed us to look inside. It is interesting to note what has changed and what hasn't changed over the years. Another important location was Villiersdorp and the farm where Cath lived for a number of years during her childhood. Located inland and not far from Stellenbosch it is another beautiful spot surrounded by mountains. Here, much had changed. The old farmhouse has gone, and other features changed to accommodate a different approach to farming. Indeed, we had difficulty identifying where the farm had been and part of the problem, common to many childhood memories was visualising from an adult's perspective. What had seemed some distance from the town as a child was in reality much closer and had led Cath to first mistaking a farm lying further out from town. After making the necessary adjustments in Cath's mind, she was then able to establish the true identity of the family farm

Change is an inevitable part of life. For many of us this can feel quite daunting. Often change happens quite naturally, simply a product of growing older. Other changes happen as a result of the choices we make. For example, Cath and I are now adapting to being married. At other times change is forced upon us, and we can all remember the changes we had to make as a result of the pandemic. I still marvel how quickly we were able to adapt and deliver church services online. It was a worrying time, and in many ways, we are still recovering from the traumas of lockdown. The changes that were imposed upon us were, we believe, necessary to reduce infection and save the lives of those most vulnerable.

At the end of the month, and before Harvest, we will as a church be focussing on climate change and how we might respond both as a church and individuals to the overwhelming evidence that the world's climate is changing and that changing weather conditions and global warming is having an adverse effect on many communities around the world. It seems there is significant increase in forest fires, floods, droughts, and often it is the poorest and most vulnerable communities that are most exposed to these risks.

I am very grateful to The St Mary's Climate Emergency Group for their work in researching and recommending ways in which we can

respond and make changes in our lives in response to concerns over climate change. Regardless of your personal view on the cause and effect of climate change, the recommendations seem eminently sensible and invariably have additional





benefits eg using the car less and walking or cycling where possible provides for a more healthy lifestyle and less pollution.

Parochial Church Council

The following report summarises some of the matters considered at the Council's meeting of 17th July.

Finance:

The Council approved costs to hire a temporary book-keeper at a very reasonable rate until the end of the year to replace Jacky Faria and to ensure the books remain up-to-date. This will give the Council time to find a more permanent replacement.

The books are being prepared for Myers Clark to independently examine, after which they will be presented to the congregation at a special Parochial General Meeting in the autumn.

The monthly Financial Report showed a deficit to 30th June of $\pounds 6,725$. This was lower than forecast thanks to the receipt of a substantial donation. We are nevertheless still heading for another significant deficit by the end of the year.

The Budget for 2023 was approved by the Council with four abstentions.

Buildings:

The Council approved funding for repainting and regilding the Church's clock faces and is looking into the feasibility of a digital display board to replace the existing board on the external office wall facing the High Street. Costs in both cases will be funded from a legacy. The Council has also approved funding to clean the stains on the floor of the church and to seal the stone. *Lunchtime concerts*: A series of ten concerts has been arranged for the autumn. The Council is looking into the possibility of obtaining sponsorship to cover costs. The involvement of Watford Rotary will also increase attendance.

Winter shelter: The Council agreed to a request from New Hope to use the Church Centre as a winter shelter for rough sleepers from 1st December 2023 until 31st March 2024.

Vicar's Report: Among other items, Tony reported Cath da Costa's ordination as priest on 30th June at St Mary's, Hitchin and on David Scourfield's ordination as deacon on 1st July. David is serving as assistant curate at All Saints, Leavesden. Tony said that the Global Lunch had been excellent and thanked Roger and Rosemary Courtney for hosting it and Andy Roby for encouraging people to attend. It had been a truly global lunch with dishes from across the world.

communities.




